"GIVE US MEN!"

Dr. William E. Fort of Knott's Berry Farm, Anaheim, California, was the featured speaker in an American Heritage Club program following chapel on November 10. Dr. Fort spoke on the subject of Americanism.

Mr. C. L. Kay, Vice President for Public Services at Lubbock Christian College, introduced the speaker as "a man of outstanding ability and personal integrity."

Dr. Fort began by telling of the two psychiatrists who encountered each other every day in an office building. Without fail, one psychiatrist spit in the other's face each day. The elevator boy in the building was puzzled by the occurrence, and asked the victim why the other fellow had acted that way. "It's his problem, not mine," was the reply. Dr. Fort used this anecdote to illustrate his point that what is happening to the United States is everybody's problem, not the other fellow's.

Dr. Fort stated that man is born with a desire for freedom. But in a society planned entirely by men, all too often "man is placed above God" and this results in a loss of freedom. This idea "that man can run his own business without God is a force that is powerful in the modern world, an idea directly opposed to the traditional American way of thinking," Dr. Fort further said. "A man can work out his own destiny better than anyone else can work it out for him."

Dr. Fort then noted that the people "vote with their dollars"; "their preferences form the basis of our economic system. You can't go against the natural laws of supply and demand. You can't regulate things—only people."

History proves that in many instances the status quo of prosperity often leads into anarchy and then tyranny, because of the indifference of the people. Benjamin Franklin once said "We are either governed by God or ruled by tyrants." Dr. Fort quoted Franklin in bringing up his concluding point: "We have a real fight on our hands to preserve freedom. At present, we have only a 50-50 chance of winning. You know, freedom is the essence of morality. Our system of liberty is no better than the people who support it. Our system is much like a mirror; it reflects what we are."
